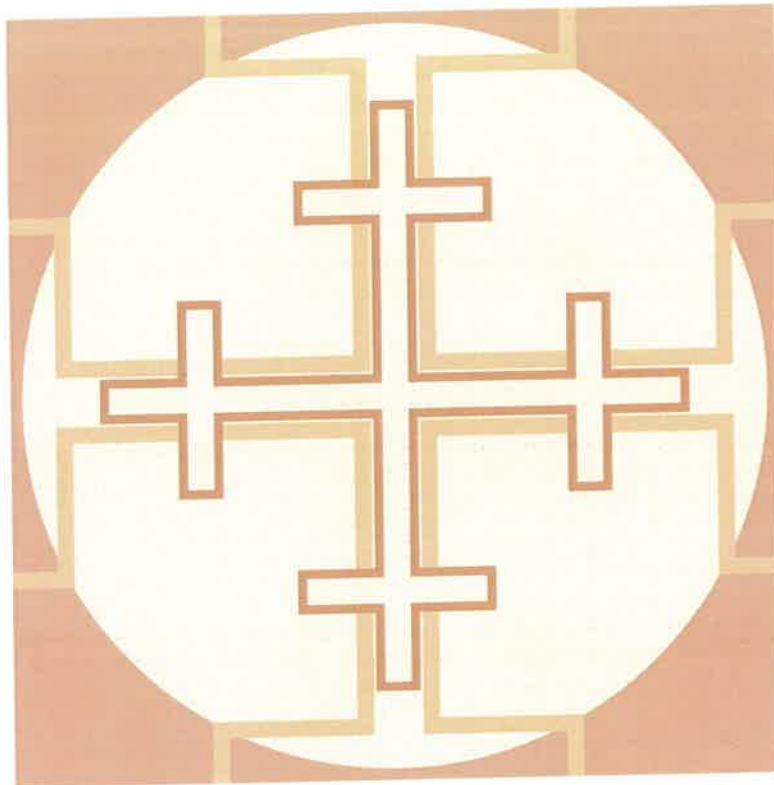

Holy Gospel: St. Matthew 15:21-28

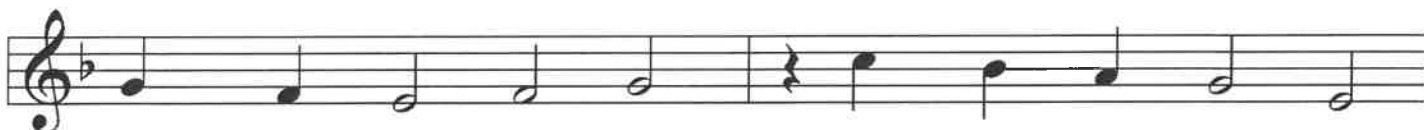

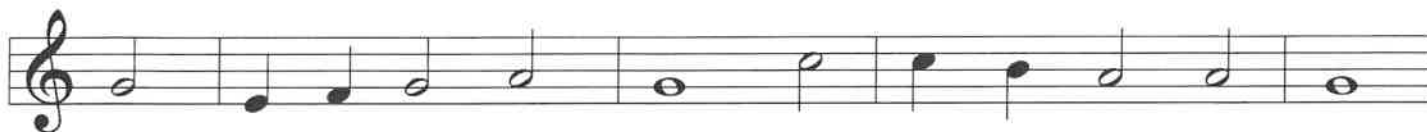
